ADMISSION

\$7 per student for groups of 20 or more; education programs are priced separately.

ADULT CHAPERONES

School tours include one free chaperone for every 10 students. Additional adults are \$12 each.

TIMED ENTRY

The Museum features a timed entry system. Please arrive at the Group Entrance by your designated entry time to ensure that your group will have access to the exhibit gallery as planned.

VISIT LENGTH

Plan to spend approximately two hours in the core exhibit, plus an additional 50 minutes if you've booked an education program.

A Hero at Sea: PT-109 and the 1960 Presidential Campaign

5th–12th Grades | 50 minutes

In 1943, Lt. John F. Kennedy's motor torpedo boat PT-109 was sunk during World War II, prompting heroic actions by Kennedy that framed his public image in 1960. Learn about the impact of this extraordinary story on the 1960 presidential campaign and how presidential candidates have used – or not used – their veteran's status as part of their political narrative.

Conflicting Evidence: The First 24 Hours After the Assassination

CSI 1963: Voices from the Crime Scene Search Unit
